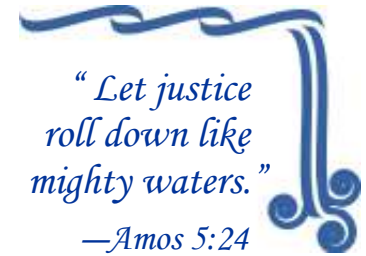
AMOS is also part of a national network of faith communities working for justice. Through WISDOM, AMOS is a partner in The GAMALIEL Foundation.
